## **Basic Seizure First Aid**

- · Stay calm & track time
- Keep child safe
- Do not restrain
- . Do not put anything in mouth
- Stay with child until fully conscious
- · Record seizure in log

## For tonic-clonic seizure:

- Protect head
  - Keep airway open/watch breathing
  - Turn child on side
